

# Community Cats/TNR Guidelines

## What is a community cat?

A community cat is one who lives outside as a part of a colony, it cannot be handled by humans and it **does not** have an owner.

## What is the Community Cat/TNR Program

The Community Cat/TNR program is for feral cats to be spayed and neutered. TNR stands for (Trap-Neuter-Return). Upon spay/neuter all cats will be altered and provided with FVRCP, rabies vaccinations, and ear tipped.

## Is this for my house cat?

No. This program is not for friendly, stray, outside cats who have an owner.

Surgery Days are Mondays and Wednesdays  
ALL cats must be dropped off between 7:00am-8:30am

Limit of TWO cats per day unless otherwise approved.

## What is required at drop off:

- Feral cats must be over 3 lbs or 3.5 months of age
- Feral cats must arrive in humane traps that are covered with a sheet or towel (other containers will not be accepted)
- Feral cats must be dropped off with an empty, clean, medium size plastic carrier with towel inside

*Do not transport cats in the trunk of your car. Drop off crates must be in good condition with bolts attached to prevent escape.*

## What is required after spay/neuter:

- Keep cat in covered carrier for 24 hours before release with food and water
- Return cat to trap location
