Dear Friends and Supporters of Nevada Humane Society:

It is my great pleasure to announce that Nevada Humane Society has received a Four-Star rating from Charity Navigator, the world's largest and most trusted nonprofit evaluator. The 2021 rating is the sixth consecutive year Nevada Humane Society has received the top rating from Charity Navigator. In addition, the raw score of 96.66 puts our organization at the top of the rankings for animal rights, welfare and services organizations as the only Four-Star rating in Nevada as well as one of the top scores among animal welfare organizations nationwide. We are very proud and humbled to receive such a positive rating for our ability to efficiently steward donation and other revenues.

This year's score reveals metrics for which Nevada Humane Society employees, volunteers, Board members, donors and supporters should be very proud. The Accountability & Transparency score of 100.00 is the highest possible score and reflects the commitment of Nevada Humane Society to be fully transparent with respect to financial and other matters. NHS dedicates a full 85.9% of its total expenses to programs. As you all know, we have an incredibly dedicated staff and volunteer corps and they work extremely hard to implement our mission to care for pets, find them homes, and save lives. Nevertheless, we are able to dedicate a large percentage of expenditures directly to programs.

Nevada Humane Society fundraising efficiency rating is \$0.05 which means only five cents are spent to raise each donated dollar. Our working capital ratio allows for 2.8 years of spending in the event of unexpected difficulties and our program expenses grow at a modest 5.3% annually. Finally, our liabilities to assets ratio is a very low 2.6%, reflecting high solvency and long-term sustainability.

We could not produce these metrics, maintain a high level of professionalism, and continue to strive for improvement in all areas of animal welfare without a true team effort. Nevada Humane Society employees are dedicated and passionate about outcomes for homeless pets and our volunteers log over 40,000 hours annually assisting with all aspects of operations and outreach. This achievement is particularly attributable to our outstanding Board of Directors who work tirelessly to govern the organization, empower its paid staff and volunteers, and provide detailed and thorough oversight of Nevada Humane Society finances and strategic planning. Please take a moment to thank our Board of Directors for their great work we hope the community is very proud to support our organization.

On behalf of everyone at Nevada Humane Society, our pledge is to continue to improve all aspects of our organization, execute our mission in a manner that makes meaningful differences each and every day, so we may enjoy the thrill of witnessing thousands of animals finding forever homes each year.
