



### TNR Guidelines

The TNR (Trap-Neuter-Return) Program is intended for feral cats to be spayed/neutered, vaccinated, and ear-tipped before being returned to their original locations. Truly feral cats cannot be handled by humans, do not have an owner, and typically live in colonies.

**Appointments** are required. Please email [reception@nevadahumanesociety.org](mailto:reception@nevadahumanesociety.org) or call at 775-473-9250 to schedule an appointment. The cost of services are **\$35.00** per cat and payment is due upon discharge.

Surgeries are on Tuesdays only. Drop off is between **7:00am and 8:30am**. Cats will be released at **3:00pm** same day. Please call if you have any questions regarding cancellations.

The clinic entrance is to the far right side of the building.

### Requirements

- Feral cats must be over 3 lbs, or 3 months of age
  - It MAY be possible for found/feral kittens 4-12 weeks of age to be admitted to the shelter as Good Samaritan Surrenders; please contact [tnr@nevadahumanesociety.org](mailto:tnr@nevadahumanesociety.org) or 775-856-2000 ext. 337 to discuss specifics and options
- Feral cats must arrive in a humane trap covered with a sheet or towel; other containers (carriers, boxes, bins) will NOT be accepted.
  - Traps can be rented from NHS when available
- Feral cats must be dropped off with an empty, clean, medium-sized plastic carrier with a towel inside to recover.

### Following pick up

- Do not transport cats in the trunk of your car as they may be exposed to extreme heat, cold, and exhaust.
- Recommend providing a small bowl of water and ½ a can of wet food per cat until morning of release.
- Keep the cat in the covered plastic cat carrier in a quiet room, bathroom, or warm garage for the night after surgery. Carefully release the following morning, gently and away from traffic.
